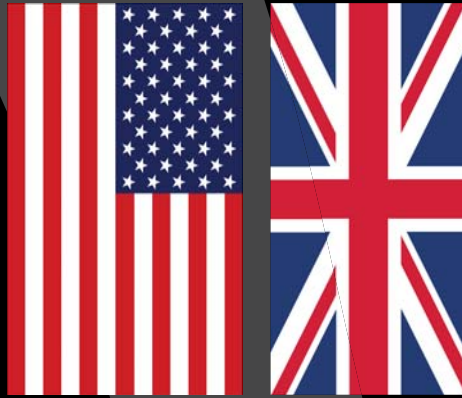

Rosalind Rescue Appeal

Cornish folk on both sides of the Atlantic, including those who love Cornwall, our history and our traditions, now have a rare opportunity to join together to rescue and preserve a piece of their Cornish maritime heritage. There is a Cornish relic in the USA which needs our help.

This is an appeal to raise the 12,000 pounds Sterling to bring the 'Rosalind', back to Newlyn in Cornwall. Rosalind is a double-ended, sailing, fishing lugger which started life in St Ives in 1903 as the Susan SS185. This is the only surviving lugger of the many built by William Paynter of St Ives, one of the most revered boatbuilders of his age.

She is now languishing in the corner of a boatyard in Oxford on Chesapeake Bay, on the East Coast of America, awaiting the chain saw - if nothing is done. Back here in Newlyn there is a suitable site, and the knowledge, the experience, the skills and the enthusiasm to restore the 114 year old Rosalind to a new lease of life as a lugger, sailing around the Cornish coast.

This rescue mission is sure to be remembered in years to come by our descendants, proud that we did our bit to preserve their heritage.
