
SHTP June Blog- Hannah Fraser

I began June with enrolling onto another online course, this time through Future Learn. I decided to start the course 'The Museum as a site and source for learning' run by the University of Glasgow. The main aim of the course was to learn how exhibitions and museum collections engage visitors and create learning experiences. The course set out how as Curators there is many different elements and ways in which you need to interpret information that should be accessible to every type of visitor to the Museum. The course was engaging and provided me with new knowledge of how to successfully do this.

Throughout this lockdown period I really wanted to use this time to further my knowledge of conservation and I have found many online resources that can help to develop this further. I found the Canadian Conservation Institute website so informative and I began reading through their preventive conservation guidelines for collections.
